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# Know your audience

Before the activity, ask your audience:

*What might help enable their full participation?*



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# Consider your positionality

Share your story and avoid speaking for others

*Consider: What is your objective? What do you want your audience to learn, reflect and/or act on?*





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# Creating a brave space

Carve out plenty of interactive opportunities and notice **power imbalances**

*Consider: How do you want people to feel throughout the activity?*

*Do you have ideas for fun and effective ice-breakers?*



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# Create a physical enabling environment

Think about the physical space and how people will experience it

*Consider: How would you arrange the space to help you meet your objectives?*



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# Time management

Plan for the time you have

*Consider planning your time by creating a session outline (see toolkit)*



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# Closing & Debrief

Collectively reflect on key takeaways, impact or next steps

*Consider asking:*

- What did we learn?
- What was new or surprising?
- What might you do differently as a result of this engagement?
- What actions will we take?

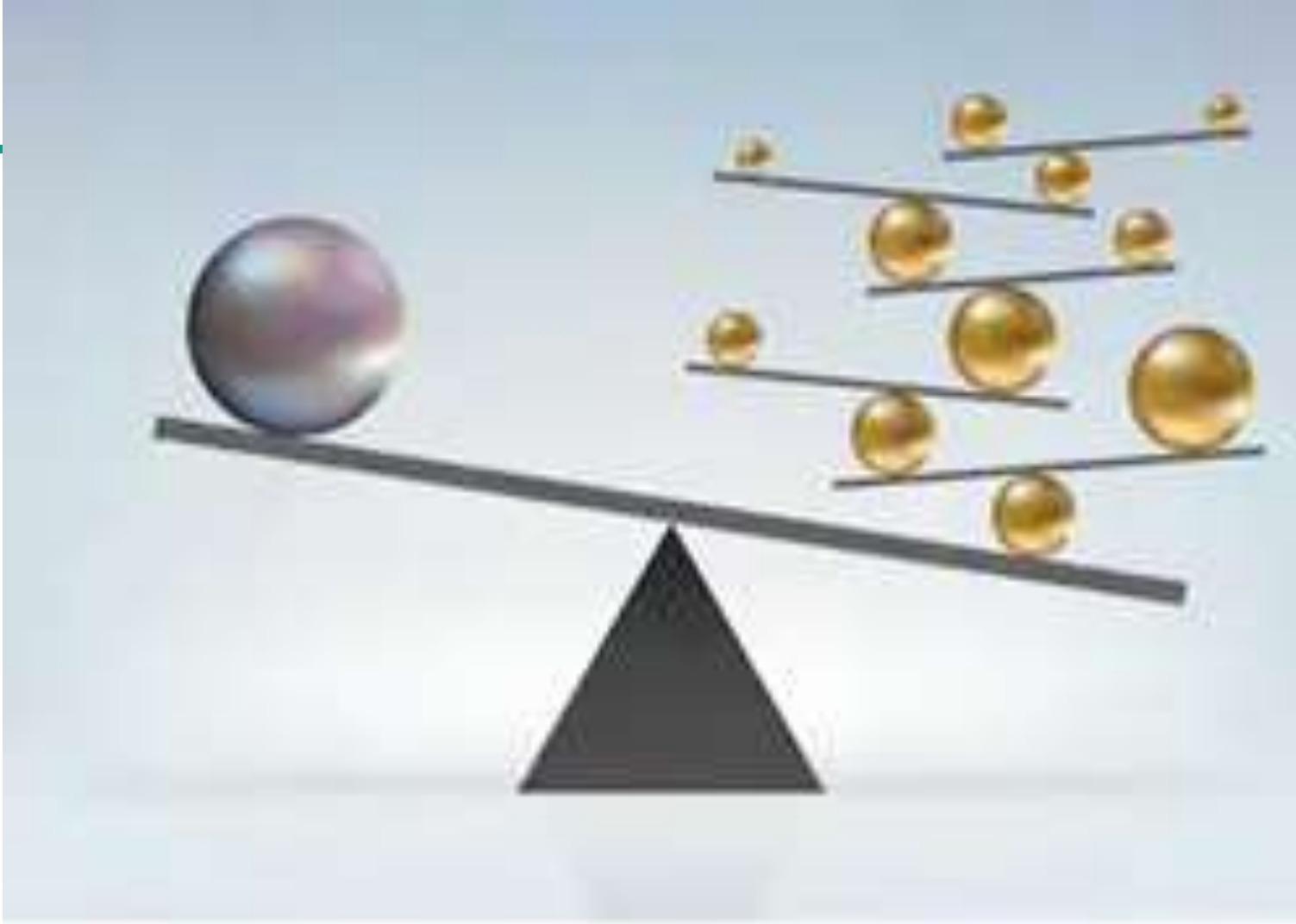
