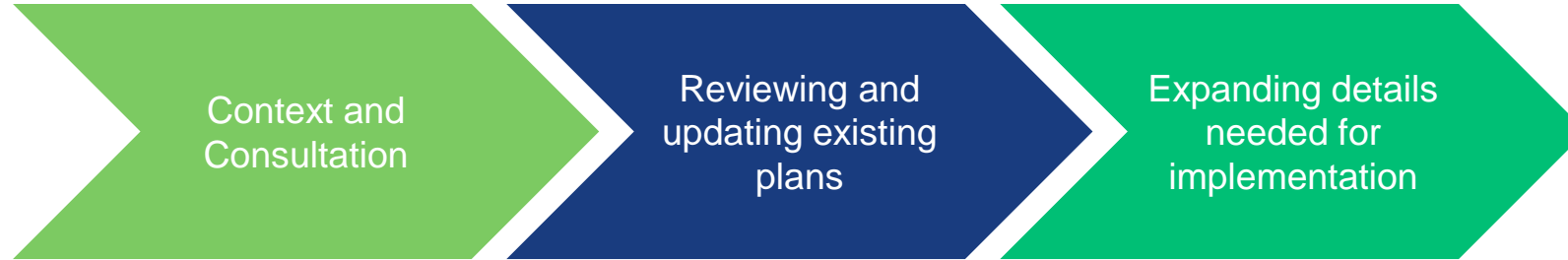

To provide FUNDERS with the required components to obtain approval and begin project implementation.

To provide YOU/YOUR PARTNERS with the opportunity to update project elements based on changes in context and confirm that all stakeholders agree with the project designs, plans, and responsibilities.

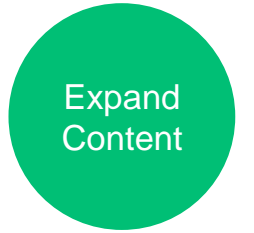
To provide YOU/YOUR PARTNERS will the detailed plans you need to oversee implementation of the project and fulfill reporting requirements later.

To provide YOU/YOUR PARTNERS with the specifics/details they need to effectively deliver project activities and conduct project monitoring.

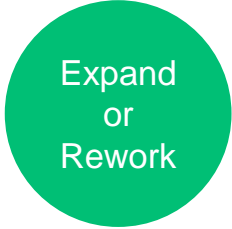

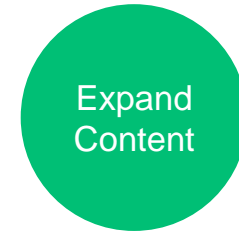
